

Word	Definition	
sail	The sails of a ship were made from strong fabric.	
	They would collect the wind that blew into them to	
	move the ship forwards.	
flag	The pirate flag was traditionally a black flag with	
	a white skull and crossbones. It showed other	
	sailors that there were pirates on board.	
rigging	The rigging was made from lots of ropes. Pirates	
	used the rigging like ladders to climb higher up	
	the ship and reach the crow's nest.	
stern	The stern was the back of the ship.	
bow	The bow (rhymes with 'now') was the front of the	
	ship.	
<i>g</i> un	The gun ports were holes in the side of the ship	
port	which could be opened so the cannons could be	
•	fired at other ships.	
mast	Masts were large wooden poles. Some ships had	
	platforms at the top of a mast called a 'crow's	
	nest' which pirates could use to look out over long	
	distances.

Continent	A continent is a large solid area of land. There are 7 continents on Earth. (Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe and Australia).
Ocean	An ocean is an area of salty water. There are 5 oceans. (Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Southern and Arctic).
